



2010 NMUN-NY Awards (Sheraton)

The National Model United Nations has established a number of criteria for evaluating performance. Each element – remaining in character, participating in committee and proper use of the rules of procedure – is equally important to the overall awards determination process. All committees are weighted equally and delegations are rated on a mathematical formula in relation to the total number of committees represented by the individual Member state (or NGO). A more complete explanation is on page 46 of the program. More than 300 universities attended the 2010 NMUN. Awards are given by NCCA in recognition of preparation, Outstanding Position Paper Awards, as well as other overall delegation awards based on work during NMUN in the categories of: Honorable Mention, Distinguished Delegation, and Outstanding Delegation. They are listed below in alphabetical order by member state (or NGO). Committee delegates voted on peer awards which will be listed by committee but in random order (not ranked).
