- \$35 registration fee, \$3 delegate or faculty adviser fee.
- First constitution and by-laws adopted, includes the creation of a Continuation Committee for the Middle Atlantic Region composed of 4 faculty, 4 students, and a non-voting member of the LNA acting as the Recording Secretary. Mrs. Harrison C. Thomas reportedly filled the LNA role.
- "In 1933, at the suggestion of Professor Karlin Capper Johnson of Syracuse University, a committee of faculty and students, under the chairmanship of Dr. Gipson of Lehigh, met to draft the document under which the Middle Atlantic Model Conferences have functioned ever since." (Dorothy B. Robins, *Adventures in Model Diplomacy*, Focus on Barnard, April 1952, p. 3.) It included faculty and student representatives of Barnard, Elmira, Haverford, Lehigh, Rochester, Temple, and Wells.
- The presentation of a silver loving cup to the delegation being the best prepared and conforming most nearly to League of Nations formality and action was instituted for the first time. Awarded to Japan - Union College.

### Governing:

For the most part, from 1927-1967, our conferences (with name changes over the years) were organized by a Continuation Committee in conjunction with a Mid-Atlantic college or university and the League of Nations Association (LNA), then its successor the American Association for the United Nations (AAUN) or their college affiliate the Collegiate Council for the United Nations (CCUN). LNA/AAUN/CCUN also sponsored other conferences. 1967 was the last conference with the CCUN sponsorship. Committee of International Relations and UN Affairs (CIRUNA) seems to have

been involved for a few years after that. On April 30, 1968 papers were signed that created the nonprofit National Collegiate Conference Association (NCCA) governing body to oversee the National Model United Nations (NMUN) conferences. In 2017 the decision was made to retire the NCCA name and operate both the conferences and the governing body under the NMUN name.

### Notes:

School numbers prior to 1969 are fairly accurate but 1946-49, 1951, 1953-64, and 1966 are estimates from news coverage. Student numbers prior to 1969 are generally from news coverage.

Prior to 1961, SGs were from the host college/university.

Work continues on finding the names of the missing Continuation Committee/Board Members.

We found references that state we started in 1923 or 1925. However, we've only been able to trace it back to 1927, which matches the timeframe when they were listing conference numbers.

A few sources incorrectly indicate that Harvard was involved in our early years as a Model League of Nations. This was probably a misstatement of their and Yale's involvement with us in the 1960s as we transitioned the conference to New York City. Harvard was involved in the New England (not the Middle Atlantic) Model Assembly of the League of Nations. They held their first conference in 1928 and disbanded around 1938.

"Even before Germany launched its invasion of Poland on September 1, 1939, the popularity

of Model League of Nations had waned considerably throughout the United States. Of the nine regional Model Assembly of the League of Nations conferences, mostly sponsored by the League of Nations Association (LNA), only the Middle Atlantic Model League of Nations continued to hold annual conferences after 1938." (University of Central Arkansas, A History of Model League of Nations in the United States, p. 20.)

"Oscar A. DeLima, Executive Vice-President of the American Association for the United Nations, noted that the Middle Atlantic Model United Nations is the parent of all other Model Assemblies."

(Model United Nations General Assembly 25th Session - 1952 25th Anniversary Conference Program, p. 7.)

More research is needed on the following, but there were international assemblies in Japan, Europe, and the United States that discussed world problems in the 1920s.

In Europe, affiliated with their campus League of Nations Union:

- Oxford University in England hosted their first International Assembly in November 1921.
- Edinburgh University in Scotland hosted their first one in 1922.

In the United States:

- The Intercollegiate Cosmopolitan Club of the City of New York's International Student Assembly discussions may have been the first to be intercollegiate. Students from New York universities and professional schools representing 70 nations participated as early as the 1922-1923 academic year.
- Harvard held their first International Assembly in January 1923.
