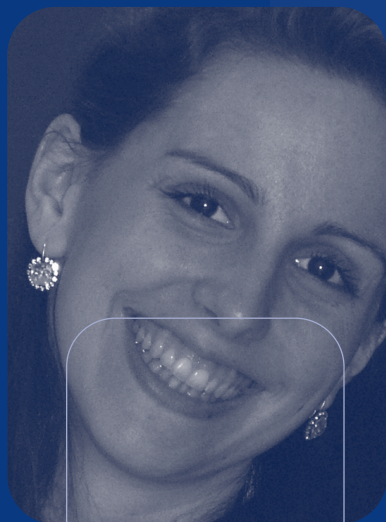
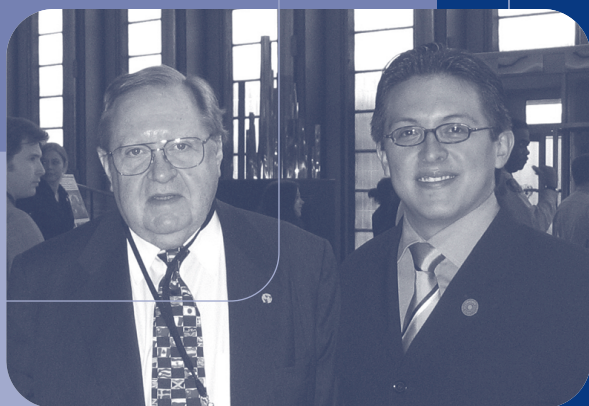

The National Collegiate Conference Association (NCCA) achieves its mission to further understanding of the United Nations and contemporary problems through experience-based learning opportunities.

Our conference, the world’s largest simulation of the United Nations, provides a forum for learning about the United Nations and a wide range of contemporary international issues. Participants leave with the insights needed to become better global citizens and the next generation of international leaders.

Cooperative, hands-on learning is our guiding principle. In pre-conference preparation, as well as during committees and hallway caucuses at the conference, students confront a range of topics that they must view from the perspective of their assigned country or non-governmental organization. Through these experiences, culminating in plenary sessions at UN Headquarters in New York, students develop an appreciation of the perspectives of other peoples, the frustration of negotiation, the rewards of cooperation, and a broader view of the human side of international relations and diplomacy.

The more than 3,400 university students and 220 faculty from five continents that attended various NCCA programs in 2005-2006 benefited from our continuing work to sustain educational quality and strengthen linkages with the United Nations. Looking ahead, we are at work to promote an ever more diverse group of volunteer staff, delegate and faculty participants.

The NCCA is grateful to the more than 75 dedicated volunteers and various donors who annually give of their time and resources to support our programs. We encourage you to consider ways you can be involved:

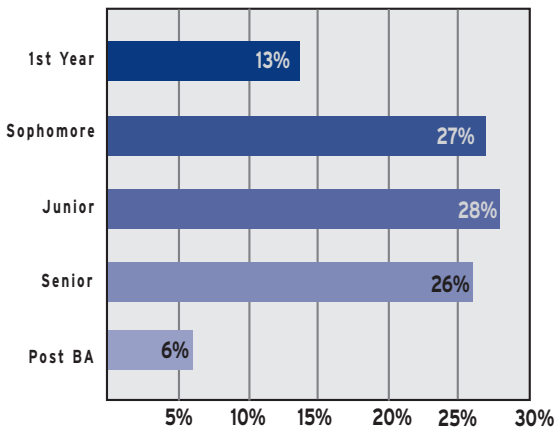

## THE NUMBERS - 06

- 3,443 student delegates
- 281 faculty members
- 239 colleges and universities
- 48% delegates from outside U.S.
- 58% student-run delegations
- 42% credit- bearing classes
- 55% / 45% female / male participation

The continued growth of the NMUN simulation - doubling in size in the past eight years - has resulted in a more diverse conference reflective of the United Nations. In 2006 - 48% of our attendees were from outside the United States.

## YEAR IN SCHOOL

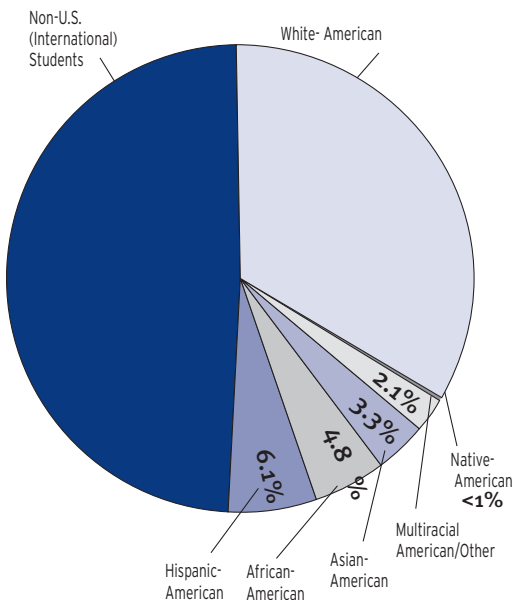

### NCCA MISSION STATEMENT

**SPEAKERS** | Ambassador Allan Rock and Mr. Karl Paschke were two of the dozens of speakers who inspired delegates. The Speakers Program is listed in the Registered Schools Section of our Web site once it is available.

**COMMITTEES** | The 2006 NMUN simulated 25 committees, including innovative sessions like the World Trade Organization and the World Conference on Disaster Reduction. A complete list of the committees and volunteer staff members who researched topics and facilitated debate can be found in our most recent Conference Program ( download).

**AFGHANI DELEGATION** | In recent years, the country of Afghanistan has received global attention. NMUN was proud to welcome the first student delegation from an Afghani university to the simulation - allowing all attendees to hear from their peers about hopes for the region.

**SCHOLARSHIPS** | The presence of students of diverse ethnic and national backgrounds adds to the realism of the simulation. Through two scholarship programs, the NCCA grants funds to defray the cost of attending NMUN. Ten schools received assistance in bringing 93 students to NMUN.
