During the 2014-15 academic year, the National Collegiate Conference Association (NCCA) provided 6,600 university students an international forum to discuss and debate pressing global issues.

#### Finding Common Ground

Our National Model United Nations (NMUN) conferences are experiential learning opportunities that allow participants to find common ground with peers from a wide range of backgrounds. With more than half of our

delegates coming from outside the United States, the conferences offer preparation for global citizenship to the next generation of international leaders. Students develop skills to continue to make a difference; they were encouraged to be forces for change in messages delivered this year by conference speakers such as H.E. Ban Ki-moon, UN Secretary-General and H.E. Jan Eliasson, UN Deputy Secretary-General.

#### Flourishing through Your Efforts

The NCCA is grateful for the dedicated individuals, past and present, whose gifts of time and resources have allowed our programs to flourish. This year we remember Ambassador Joseph H. Melrose, Jr., a former student delegate, faculty advisor and NCCA Board member, who passed away in November. ### Our Mission

To advance understanding of the UN System and contemporary global issues through quality educational programs that emphasize collaboration and cooperative conflict resolution and prepare participants for active global citizenship.



### **Experiential Learning Programs**

Our programs provide a diverse group of informed students and their faculty advisors a forum for addressing global



concerns in a real world context. Conferences address important issues including regional conflicts, peacekeeping, human rights, women and children, economic and social development, and the environment. Our goal is to provide a better understanding of the inner workings of the UN as students build skills in diplomacy and compromise. In the past year, 6,600 university students from six continents attended our conferences in New York City; Washington, DC; and Rome, Italy.

### Growth and Development of Participants

Attendees report NMUN significantly contributes to becoming a better global citizen by:

- 96% Increasing understanding of the complexities of international relations
- 97% Increasing knowledge of the functions, structure and limitations of the UN
- 98% Expanding knowledge of political, economic and social conditions in other countries
- 95% Teaching better understanding of different perspectives on global issues

Attendees also report NMUN helps develop these skills:

- 96% Negotiation and Conflict Resolution
- 94% Team-building
- 91% Leadership
- 91% Public Speaking
- 95% Research
- 92% Writing






